1997 | Dorothy Knight and Joan Mackechnie | Pankina Auxiliary

1998 | Phyll Unsworth | Frankston Auxiliary

2005 | Olive Cooper | Heart to Heart Auxiliary

2008 | Irene Hubbard | Prem Bubs Auxiliary

2012 | Robyn Anderson | CasKids Auxiliary

As a leader and motivator, Robyn is a driving force in arranging fashion parades, dinners, auctions, trivia nights, market stalls, raffles and other fundraising activities for CasKids.
